 Ordered by the Court that the said John Harris  
 Sheriff of North County should be sworn of the Peace  
 by the Court here present before the right Honourable the Lord Proprietor  
 in the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds of Silver and  
 made and sworn on their Oath to govern and Chastise the said  
 Towns and to the use of his said Majesty his heirs & assigns  
 upon Condition that he should not come upon the County  
 These things being required to be done the said John Harris  
 in Law

His Majesty's Commission bearing date the third of  
 North County on the twenty first Day  
 John Harris of August in the County of North  
 your Majesty's Sheriff of the County of North  
 Lord Seventeen hundred thirty three that he should take John  
 Harris late of St. Pauls parish in the County of Middlesex  
 should be found in your Bailwick and him safe keep so that you  
 have his body before the Justice of our next County Court to be hold  
 at our Court house in the Town of Newmarket in said County on the third  
 Tuesday of November next to receive into a certain Information  
 for committing a villainy with a certain Elizabeth Young the wife  
 of John Young and that the Sheriff of North County have at the time  
 and place the said Writ

And now heard at this Day to wit the sixteenth day of November  
 the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred thirty three Cometh  
 William Harris Esq. Sheriff of North County and made return  
 to the Court here present as follows vizt  
 The corpus of W. Harris Sheriff N. Co. by  
 North County sh. Be it remembered that John Francis Esq. our
