

(I) UPON THE TERMINATION OF ACTIVE SERVICE OF ANY PERSON WHO HAS HELD THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL AFTER 1970, THERE SHALL BE PAID, WHEN THE GENERAL BECOMES SIXTY YEARS OF AGE AND FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE GENERAL'S LIFE, A PENSION CALCULATED AT THE RATE OF \$850 FOR EACH YEAR OF ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE FOR THE STATE OF MARYLAND; BUT IN NO EVENT MAY THE TOTAL PENSION OR SALARY EXCEED \$13,600. FOLLOWING THE DEATH OF A FORMER ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL, THE SURVIVING SPOUSE SHALL BE PAID TWO THIRDS OF THE PENSION TO WHICH THE FORMER ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL WAS OR WOULD HAVE BEEN ENTITLED TO UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IF THE SURVIVING SPOUSE WAS MARRIED TO THE GENERAL FOR NOT LESS THAN THE THREE YEARS IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO THE DEATH, AND IN THE CASE OF A RETIRED ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL, NOT LESS THAN THE THREE YEARS IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO THE RETIREMENT. THE SURVIVING SPOUSE SHALL BE PAID FOR LIFE UNLESS THE SPOUSE REMARRIES IN WHICH EVENT THE PAYMENTS ARE TO CEASE. ANY PENSION OR SALARY PAID UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION IS IN ADDITION TO AND DOES NOT AFFECT ANY BENEFITS PAID TO THE SAME PERSON FROM OR BY ANOTHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM OPERATED BY THIS STATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
