(c) (1) Allegany County — a witness is allowed [8] 12 cents per mile for each mile over [five] THREE he resides from the court. This amount is allowed only once in one term. A WITNESS ATTENDING COURT IS ALLOWED \$5 FOR EACH DAY IN ATTENDANCE PLUS ITINERANT CHARGES ALLOWABLE TO WITNESSES FROM OTHER COUNTIES.
