

Maryland (1974 Volume and 1974 Supplement) to read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

1-706.

(A) A JUDGE IS ENTITLED TO MILEAGE, AT THE RATE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, FOR OFFICIALLY AUTHORIZED TRAVEL OUTSIDE HIS COUNTY OF RESIDENCE ON JUDICIAL BUSINESS [[, AND]] . HE IS ALSO ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR REASONABLE COSTS OF MEALS, LODGING, AND OTHER EXPENSES ACTUALLY INCURRED WITH THE OFFICIALLY AUTHORIZED TRAVEL[[, OR ANY OF THEM IF THE JUDGE WHO AUTHORIZES THE TRAVEL SO DIRECTS , AND AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.]] IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROVISIONS OF THE STATE JOINT TRAVEL REGULATIONS PROVIDED THAT SUCH REIMBURSEMENT IS APPROVED BY THE JUDGE AUTHORIZING THE TRAVEL AND PROVIDED FOR IN THE STATE BUDGET. [[THESE EXPENSES SHALL BE PAID BY THE STATE AS PROVIDED IN THE BUDGET]].

(B) REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES ACTUALLY INCURRED BY A CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE IN CONNECTION WITH HIS DUTIES, OTHER THAN THE EXPENSES DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, SHALL BE PAID BY THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION IN WHICH THE CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE RESIDES, AS PROVIDED IN THAT SUBDIVISION'S BUDGET, AND AS FIRST APPROVED BY THE STATE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

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CHAPTER 280

(Senate Bill 136)

AN ACT concerning

Crimes and Punishments - Escaping from Penitentiary

FOR the purpose of making an escapee, upon conviction, liable for the expenses incurred in his return; authorizing the Commissioner of Correction to establish certain regulations [[and procedures for charging an escapee with, and collection of, those expenses]]; adding lettering as appropriate; and clarifying language.
