(b) The Chief Judge of the District Court may make [rules] ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS for the governing of the District Court, subject to and not inconsistent with the rules of the Court of Appeals.

- (c) (1) The filing fees and costs in a civil case are those prescribed by law subject to modification by law, [[or]] rule, OR ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION.
- (2) The Court of Appeals may provide by rule for waiver of prepayment of filing fees and other costs in cases in indigency.
