(a) Any person desiring to COMMERCIALLY practice the art of taxidermy or who desires to mount or preserve any species of finfish legally acquired, first, shall apply for a taxidermist and fur-tanning license. A taxidermist and fur-tanning license also shall permit the holder to mount, preserve, or tan any species of wildlife legally acquired as well as finfish.
