SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 74A(c) of Article 41 — Governor—Executive and Administrative Departments, of the Annotated Code of Haryland (1971 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed and re—enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Article 41 - Governor-Executive and Administrative Departments

74A.

(c) On the reverse of the seal (used as the official seal of Maryland) is Lord Baltimore's hereditary coat of arms. The first and fourth quarters represent the arms of the Calvert family described in heraldic language as a paly of six pieces, or (gold) and sable (black) a bend counterchanged. The first and fourth quarters are the left-hand top quarter and the right-hand bottom quarter. The second and third quarters show the arms of the Crossland family, which Cecil inherited from his grandmother, Alicia, wife of Leonard Calvert, the father of George, first Lord Baltimore.
