Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages Section 158(d) (2) Annotated Code of Maryland (1968 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 158(d) (2) of Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1968 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

158.

In addition to the powers given to the (2) board of license commissioners for Anne Arundel County in subsections (a) and (b) of this section, the board is authorized to employ one part-time chief inspector at an annual salary of \$3,600, and [six] EIGHT part-time inspectors at an annual salary of \$1,800 each. addition to the above-mentioned salary, each of the inspectors shall be reimbursed for travel expenses reasonably incurred by them, subject to the approval of the State Comptroller. The [[seven]] NINE inspectors so appointed for Anne Arundel County have all the powers of a peace officer or a constable or sheriff of the State of Maryland, and shall make oath to faithfully perform the duties entrusted to them, as provided in Article 1, § 6 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, and shall furnish bond in the penalty of \$2,000 to the board of license commissioners of Anne Arundel County and the Board of County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County jointly. conditioned "that inspector shall well faithfully execute the office in all things appertaining thereto. The cost of the bond shall be paid by the Commissioners of Anne Arundel County. County inspectors for Anne Arundel County shall be known as "liquor inspectors for Anne Arundel County." There shall be a full-time administrator to the board whose annual salary shall be fixed by the board not exceeding \$8,500 nor less than \$7,500. There shall be a full-time secretary to the board whose annual salary shall be fixed by the board not exceeding, \$7,360 nor less than \$6,500, and a full-time clerk to the board at [any] AN annual salary of \$3,300, and an attorney to the board, at an annual salary of \$3,000.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
