WHICH SHALL SET FORTH THE NATURE, EXTENT AND LIQUIDITY OF THE CANDIDATE'S ASSETS AND THE DISPOSABLE NET INCOME OF THE CANDIDATE. THE BOARD WITH WHICH THE CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY IS FILED MAY CONDUCT AN INVESTIGATION OF THE CANDIDATE'S FINANCIAL STATUS IF THE CIRCUMSTANCES SO WARRANT: AND

- (II) A PETITION SIGNED BY NOT LESS THAN 1-1/2 PERCENT OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE FOR THE OFFICE WHICH IS SOUGHT BY THE CANDIDATE WHICH STATES THAT THE SIGNERS ARE AWARE OF AND ACKNOWLEDGE THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE PETITIONER'S CANDIDACY. ALL OTHER REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PETITION SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PETITIONS FILED UNDER SECTION 7-1 OF THIS ARTICLE, EXCEPT THAT THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 7-1 (D) DO NOT APPLY.
- (2) A CANDIDATE WHO FILES THE MATERIALS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION AND WHO IS ALSO SEEKING TO BE NOMINATED BY PETITION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 7-1 MAY INCLUDE THE PERCENTAGE OF REGISTERED VOTERS REQUIRED BY PARAGRAPH (1) (II) OF THIS SUBSECTION WITHIN THE PERCENTAGE OF VOTERS REQUIRED BY SECTION 7-1.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 400

(House Bill 73)

AN ACT concerning

Workmen's Compensation - Federal Benefits

FOR the purpose of withdrawing application of the Workmen's Compensation law to certain persons; making certain exceptions; and correcting certain punctuation errors.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments,

Article 101 - Workmen's Compensation Section 26(d) Annotated Code of Maryland (1964 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement)
