

visiting and inspecting every licensed premises in Prince George's County periodically and carrying on such other duties as the board of license commissioners of Prince George's County might prescribe. There shall be [six] EIGHT full-time and [four] 12 part-time inspectors all of whom shall be residents of Prince George's County, Maryland. All [six] EIGHT full-time inspectors who meet the standards set out by the Prince George's County merit board and who are certified by the personnel director as meeting these standards shall be entitled to the provisions of the county merit system. The board of license commissioners for Prince George's County shall designate annually a chief inspector from among the [six] EIGHT full-time inspectors. The chief inspector, under the direction of the board of license commissioners, shall regulate the duties, hours, and assignments of the various inspectors.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 457

(House Bill 920)

AN ACT concerning

Railroads - Equipment For Certain Employees

FOR the purpose of requiring railroads to have certain equipment installed for certain employees who ride on locomotives or cabooses and to provide a certain penalty.

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That new Section 460A be and it is hereby added to Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume and 1974
