

(2) EXCEPT AS LIMITED IN (3) THE OFFICERS HAVE THE SAME POWER AND LEGAL AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE PARKING ORDINANCES, LAWS AND REGULATIONS AS DO POLICE OFFICERS OF THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT.

(3) THE SPECIAL PARKING ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS MAY NOT ARREST OR TAKE INTO CUSTODY ANY PERSON FOR THE VIOLATION OF PARKING ORDINANCES, LAWS OR REGULATIONS OR OTHERWISE HAVE THE POWER OF ARREST IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITY. A RECORD OF THE APPOINTMENT OF THE OFFICERS SHALL BE KEPT BY THE COMMISSIONER AND ANY APPOINTMENT MAY BE REVOKED BY HIM AT ANY TIME. THE FORM OF THE BADGE AND THE TYPE OF UNIFORM THAT MAY BE WORN BY THESE OFFICERS MUST BE APPROVED BY THE POLICE COMMISSIONER.

(4) THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONTINUE TO ENFORCE THE LAWS REGULATING PARKING AND ARE NOT RELIEVED OF ANY DUTY BY THIS SECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 608

(Senate Bill 797)

AN ACT concerning

Retail Service Stations

FOR the purpose of banning the operation of retail service stations by management firms operating under certain contracts with the producer or refiner and providing that stations must be operated by retail service station dealers.
