

benefit may change such election by due notice to the board of trustees, but no change may be made after the first payment of his allowance becomes normally due.

(1) If the member dies before he has received in payments the present value of his retirement allowance as it was at the time of his retirement, the balance shall be paid to his legal representatives or to such person as he shall nominate by written designation duly acknowledged and filed with the board of trustees; or

(2) Upon his death, his reduced retirement allowance shall be continued throughout the life of and paid to such person as he shall nominate by written designation duly acknowledged and filed with the board of trustees at the time of his retirement; or

(3) Upon his death, one half of his reduced retirement allowance shall be continued throughout the life of and paid to such person as he shall nominate by written designation duly acknowledged and filed with the board of trustees at the time of his retirement; or

(4) Some other benefit or benefits shall be paid either to the member or to such person or persons as he shall nominate, provided such other benefit or benefits, together with the reduced retirement allowance, shall be certified by the actuary to be of equivalent actuarial value of his retirement allowance, and shall be approved by the board of trustees.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

AN ACT concerning

State Police - Retirement Allowance

FOR the purpose of correcting an omission in Chapters 459 and 460 of the Acts of 1973 by providing a supplement to the retirement allowance paid to certain persons under the Old State Police Pension Fund.
