

(A-1) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, A SCHOOL OF COSMETOLOGY MAY PERMIT STUDENTS WHO HAVE COMPLETED 1000 HOURS OF FUNDAMENTAL TRAINING TO PRACTICE BEAUTY CULTURE BY WAY OF CLINICAL WORK [[ON RESIDENTS OF HOMES FOR THE ELDERLY AND]] ON PERSONS CONFINED IN OR TO PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES, AND STATE AND LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES. HOWEVER, THE PERSONS SO CONFINED MUST BE WILLING TO SUBMIT THEMSELVES TO SUCH PRACTICE AFTER HAVING FIRST BEEN PROPERLY INFORMED THAT THE OPERATOR IS A STUDENT. NO MORE THAN EIGHT QUALIFIED STUDENTS ASSIGNED TO A PARTICULAR INSTRUCTOR IN THE SCHOOL OF COSMETOLOGY MAY BE PERMITTED TO PRACTICE BEAUTY CULTURE UNDER THE TERMS OF THIS SECTION AT ANY ONE TIME.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 664

(House Bill 244)

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Warning Signals on Projecting Loads

FOR the purpose [[of]] of providing the manner in which lamps, reflectors and flags shall be displayed on projecting loads on vehicles; [[and]] exempting certain vehicles; making Maryland requirements uniform with those contained in federal regulations; and revising and clarifying language.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 12-213 of Article 66 1/2 - Vehicle Laws, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1970 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Article 66 1/2 - Vehicle Laws
