CHAPTER 830

(House Bill 1654)

AN ACT concerning**Juvenile Causes - Waiver of Jurisdiction**

FOR the purpose of providing for certain standards and procedures to be used by the Criminal Court in waiving jurisdiction over persons not adults; generally relating to a certain waiver of jurisdiction; clarifying language; and adding lettering as appropriate.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 594A of Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

594A.

(A) In any case involving a child who has reached [his fourteenth (14th) birthday] 14 YEARS OF AGE but has not reached [his eighteenth (18th) birthday] 18 YEARS OF AGE at the time of any alleged offense excluded under the provisions of § 3-808 of the Courts Article of the Code, the court exercising jurisdiction may transfer the case to the juvenile court if a waiver is believed to be in
