the interests of the child [and/] or society.

- (B) IN MAKING A DETERMINATION AS TO WAIVER OF JURISDICTION THE COURT SHALL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:
  - (1) AGE OF CHILD:
  - (2) MENTAL AND PHYSICAL CONDITION OF CHILD:
- (3) THE CHILD'S AMENABILITY TO TREATMENT IN ANY INSTITUTION, FACILITY, OR PROGRAM AVAILABLE TO DELINQUENTS;
  - (4) THE NATURE OF THE ALLEGED OFFENSE: AND
  - (5) THE PUBLIC SAFETY.
- (C) FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING ITS DETERMINATION, THE COURT MAY REQUEST THAT A STUDY CONCERNING THE CHILD, HIS FAMILY, HIS ENVIRONMENT, AND OTHER MATTERS RELEVANT TO THE DISPOSITION OF THE CASE BE MADE.
- (D) IF THE JURISDICTION IS WAIVED, THE COURT MAY ORDER THE PERSON HELD FOR TRIAL UNDER THE REGULAR PROCEDURES OF THE JUVENILE COURT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
