

the interests of the child [and/] or society.

(B) IN MAKING A DETERMINATION AS TO WAIVER OF JURISDICTION THE COURT SHALL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:

- (1) AGE OF CHILD;
- (2) MENTAL AND PHYSICAL CONDITION OF CHILD;
- (3) THE CHILD'S AMENABILITY TO TREATMENT IN ANY INSTITUTION, FACILITY, OR PROGRAM AVAILABLE TO DELINQUENTS;
- (4) THE NATURE OF THE ALLEGED OFFENSE; AND
- (5) THE PUBLIC SAFETY.

(C) FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING ITS DETERMINATION, THE COURT MAY REQUEST THAT A STUDY CONCERNING THE CHILD, HIS FAMILY, HIS ENVIRONMENT, AND OTHER MATTERS RELEVANT TO THE DISPOSITION OF THE CASE BE MADE.

(D) IF THE JURISDICTION IS WAIVED, THE COURT MAY ORDER THE PERSON HELD FOR TRIAL UNDER THE REGULAR PROCEDURES OF THE JUVENILE COURT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 831

(House Bill 1661)

AN ACT concerning

Hospitals - Rates

FOR the purpose of permitting hospitals to adopt certain partial rate increases without waiving the right to appeal the denial of the remainder of a requested increase; requiring that certain records of rate payments be kept and providing a certain method for rate refunds.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments,

Article 43 - Health
