RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Governor be requested to set aside one day each year to pay tribute to the family and to call forth those values of loyalty, devotion, and love, which constitute the essence of a family unit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution be sent to the Governor, the Honorable Marvin Mandel.

A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

The Social Security Building at the Metro  
West Site
