(House Joint Resolution 101)

A House Joint Resolution concerning

Diploma Schools of Nursing

FOR the purpose of establishing a commission to study the problems of registered nurses and to make a certain report.

WHEREAS, Hospital Diploma Schools of Nursing have educated the majority of practicing Registered Nurses in the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, Registered Nurses educated in a hospital's academic and clinical setting are fully prepared upon licensing to undertake their full scope of duties to patients; and

WHEREAS, The Health Services Cost Review Commission has questioned certain financial aspects of educating nurses in Diploma Schools, suggesting new public policy which would prohibit hospital patients from contributing for education of nurses; and
