In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1013.

This bill authorizes Baltimore City to borrow one million dollars to improve street lighting.

Senate Bill 655, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 22, 1975, accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore, it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 1013.
