Crimes. For the purpose of adding to the Constitution of Maryland a provision for the suspension without pay or benefits of certain elected officials from office upon conviction of or the entry of certain pleas to certain crimes and for the removal of such officials if the final, conviction becomes after judicial review: providing for the appointment of a person to tempororily such elective office during such suspension; providing for the reinstatement of such elected official certain circumstances: providing for of benefits under restoration and certain pay circumstances: generally relating to suspension removal of certain elected officials for certain misconduct and the filling of vacancies thus created; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State for adoption or rejection.

And it is hereby certified that at said election, 519,886 votes were cast for the adoption of said Chapter 879 and 74,582 votes were cast against the adoption of said Chapter 879, the said Chapter 879 of the Acts of 1974 has therefore been ratified by the qualified voters of the State of Maryland.
