OYSTER DREDGING

whereas, Pursuant to Chapter 403 of the acts of 1974, the General Assembly of Maryland added Section 4-307 to the Natural Resources Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1974 Volume and 1974 Supplement), authorizing the Potomac River Fisheries Commission to make, adopt and publish rules and regulations for the dredging of oysters with handscrapes in areas of the Potomac River within its jurisdiction, and to levy license fees for this dredging; and
