

MUNICIPAL CHARTERS

Section 16-45. Auditor - Nominations.

There shall be an auditor for the Town of Brunswick. On or before the 25th day of August in each year in which the Mayor is elected, [the Finance Commission] THE MAYOR-ELECT shall send to the [Mayor-Elect] COUNCIL a list containing the names of two or more qualified certified public accountants as nominees for the office of Town Auditor.

Section 16-46. Same - Appointments; Oath.

On or before the 15th day of September in the year the Mayor is elected, the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint one of such nominees [from the Finance Commission] as Town Auditor. Before taking office, the Town Auditor shall take and subscribe before the Mayor an oath that he will well and truly perform the duties of his office.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a complete and exact copy of the foregoing Resolution be posted at the Brunswick City Hall for a period of at least forty (40) days commencing on July 9, 1974; and that a fair summary of the foregoing Resolution be published in the Brunswick Citizen at least four (4) times at weekly intervals during the aforesaid forty (40) day period; and that the foregoing Resolution shall become a part of the Municipal Charter of Brunswick on the fiftieth (50th) day following its adoption unless a petition requesting a referendum on the matter is submitted to the Mayor and Council of Brunswick on or before the fortieth (40th) day following the adoption of this Resolution, in compliance with the provisions of Article 23A, Section 13 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended, and its supplements).
