A PERSON MAY NOT BE IMPRISONED FOR VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF AN ORDER OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OR AN AGREEMENT OF A PARTY RELATING TO UNIT PRICING UNDER TITLE 14. SUBTITLE 1 OF THIS ARTICLE.

THIS TITLE MAY BE CITED AS THE MARYLAND CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT.
