The Military Department, with the prior approval of the Board of Public Works, [is] may sell from time to time the armories that are superfluous to its requirements. The county or municipal corporation in which any such armory is located shall have first right of refusal to purchase the armory. The proceeds of the sale shall be placed in the Annuity Bond Fund. If the county or municipal corporation declines to purchase the property, it shall be sold at public sale for the highest cash price obtainable and the proceeds shall be placed in the Annuity Bond Fund.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 79

(Senate Bill 233)

AN ACT concerning

Fish and Fisheries - Oyster Taxes

FOR the purpose of eliminating an inspection tax for certain oysters caught in the waters of the State; simplifying the procedure for collecting the inspection tax on imported and exported oysters; increasing the severance tax on Maryland oysters; and simplifying the procedures for collecting the severance tax.
