SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 12 of Article 75 1/2 — Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1969 Replacement Volume and 1974 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed and re—enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

## Article 75 1/2 - Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors

12.

Application for registration as a professional engineer, for certification as an engineer-in-training, for registration as a professional land surveyor or for certification as a land surveyor-in-training or for registration as a property line surveyor shall be on a form prescribed and furnished by the Board: shall contain statements made under oath showing the applicant's education and a detailed summary of his technical experience; shall contain not less than five references, of for a professional engin**ee**r engineer-in-training applicant, three or more shall, unless excused by the Board, be professional engineers having personal knowledge of his engineering experience for a professional land surveyor or land surveyor-in-training applicant, or for a property line surveyor applicant, three or more shall, unless excused by the Board, be professional land surveyors having personal knowledge of his land surveying experience; and shall contain or be accompanied by any other relevant material or information, such as a certificate issued by the National Council of Engineering[,] Examiners or its The following shall be considered as minimum successor. evidence satisfactory to the Board that the applicant is qualified for registration as a professional engineer, or professional land surveyor, or for certification as an engineer-in-training, or a land surveyor-in-training, or for registration as a property line surveyor, respectively.

## [(a)](B) As a professional engineer:

(1) Graduation from an engineering curriculum of four scholastic years or more or their equivalent approved by the Board; a specific record of an additional four years or more of experience in engineering work of a character satisfactory to the Board and indicating that the applicant may be competent to practice engineering (in counting years of experience, the Board at its
