I do hereby declare Jam very well with his God, that the within mentioned Thomas Glavin of Lunington in the County of Southampton is the eldest Brother of Bartholomew Glavin Surgeon Deceased in Maryland, and that he is ready to what estate the said Bartholomew might leave in Maryland, Given under my hand this thirtieth of July One thousand six hundred seventy eight. In Baltimore

To all Christian People to whom these presents shall come I Thomas Glavin of Lunington in the County of Southampton in the Kingdom of England Gent eldest Brother and heir of Bartholomew Glavin of Maryland Surgeon Deceased and living in our Lord God our blessing knoweth that this said Thomas Glavin for divers good causes and considerations and reasons especially moving him made consulted Ordained authorized appointed and in my place by those presents here put the Right Hon^{ble} Charles Lord Baron of Baltimore Proprietor of the Province of Maryland and Chalou in America my true sufficient and Lawfull Attorney doth will to enter for me and in my name into all and singular the judgments Decretes Lawes Statutes Ordinances and other estate whatsoever either real or personall which my said Brother Bartholomew Glavin did possess or possess of and intermedd in in Maryland or elsewhere in America also to aske gather receive and return for me and in my name and to my use of and from all and every person and persons whatsoever all such Debts Dues and profits of the premises as was due and owing to my said Brother, or which hath accrued or become due unto me as here unto him said this Decease had also giving and by these presents granting unto my said Attorney full power and authority to sell, Lease, Drive or otherwise dispose of the said Lands & premises or any part or part thereof to such person or persons and for such estate or estates as shall to my said Attorney seeme most advantageous and beneficial for me also for me and in my name to make seals and Deeds as my sufficient Deed or Deeds in the Law All and singular such Judgments Lawes Grants Deeds Receipts Acquittances as well general as special, and other writing whatsoever my said Attorney shall thinke requisite touching and concerning the premises or any of them or otherwise And further my Attorney or Attorneys in any matter cause or thing relating to the premises under him or me to substitute substitute deput make and appoint and at the liberty and pleasure of my said Attorney the same to do make And finally for me and in my name to compound for, follow, settle, execute, accomplish and finish all and every suits and Controversies and after to be moved between me and any other person or persons whatsoever touching or concerning the premises or any part or part thereof as fully and absolutely as might should or ought Lawfully do if I were then and there personally present And I do hereby Covenant to hold firm and stable whatsoever my said Attorney shall do or cause to be done for me and in my name in and about the premises or any of them by virtue of these presents In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the fourth day of October in the thirtieth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles the second by the Grant of God England Scotland France and Ireland defend of the faith &c. of the fourth of June 1678
