Memorandum That this present day to wit the ninth and Twentieth day of May in the fourth year of the Dominion of the Right Hon^{ble} Charles Lord Baltimore Charles now Absent Lord and Proprietary of the said Province of Maryland &c. in pursuance of a certain renewed Order of the Court of the same Province held at City of St Marys and dated the first day of October last past before the date hereof for Continuance of a former and Original Order here before that made for one whole year longer in a certain Cause in the same Court depending between Mary Roe Heir of Edward Roe Gent Deceased of the one part and John Ingram of the other part Touching a certain Attachment there granted to the said Mary and in part Executed on certain bills and accounts belonging to the estate of the said Ingram she the said Mary Roe said principal together with William Combes and George Cowley Gent all Jurors of and for her the said Mary came before me Henry Coursey one of his said Lordships Council of and for the said Province and one of the Justices of the same Court and personally acknowledged themselves Joyntly and severally to owe and be indebted unto his said now Lordship his heirs Successors or assigns at the feast of the birth of our Lord Christ now next ensuing the date hereof the said Recognizors are willing and for themselves and heirs of them and for their heirs and assigns heirs Executors and admors Do and do they Joyntly and severally grant by these presents that in case of default shall be made in payment of the said summe in forme aforesaid then that the same summe of eleven hundred pounds Sterling or the full value thereof as Levy made had and recovered of the severall and respective Mannors Messuages Lands Tenements Goods Chattels and hereditaments of them the said Mary Roe William Combes and George Cowley heirs severall and respective heirs Executors and admors or some one any or either of them or for soever they shall or may be found by vertue of these presents

Which deforcance and upon Condition never to be according to the Tenor Scope and intent of the above mentioned Original and renewed order or orders of Court that in the above said Provincial Court and all and every the members of the same shall from time to time and at all times be sufficiently and impinged against all actions and suits or other matters that shall or may happen Touching or concerning the above mentioned attachment or the Granting or making the said order or renewing thereof, that the said the above bounden Mary Roe her Executors admors assigns or some one of them do or shall make satisfaction of the bills acc^{ts} and other parts and parcels of the estate of the above named John Ingram attached by vertue of the said attachment or the value thereof respectively in proportion unto the said John Ingram or his Attorney do or shall within a year and a day to be computed from the said first day of October last past before the date of the Recognizance above written being the time of the renewing of the said order for one year longer as above said and make his and their Justices of the said Province and proceed on in the above said account and usual or common course likewise make it appear that she the said Mary is satisfied of and for her Just demands in part or in full that the said Recognizance above written specified acknowledged and uttered into forme aforesaid shall read and contain and be in the words following to wit
