Scotland France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c. before Josiah
Gouge Notary Publick in London by authority of our said Sovereign Lord
the King. Admitted and sworn dwelling in the City of London and in the presence
of the Witnesses after Named personally appeared Mr John Rawdon, of London
aforesaid Merchant unto our Notary well knowne who hath made Ordained &
in his stead and place hath put and Constituted, And by these presents doth make
Ordained and in his stead and place doth put and Constituted The Right Honorable Charles
Lord Baltimore Governour of the province of Maryland in America, and Captaine
William Digg of Maryland aforesaid Merchant to bee his true and Lawfull Attorneys
and assigns Giving unto them Joyntly or severally full power authority and speciall
Charge for in the name and to the use of him Constituant to Aske demand Levy
Recover and receive of and from Capt John Lingley of Maryland aforesaid Merchant
his heeres Executors or any other person or persons who shall or may hereafter
concerned and Out of and from his heere or any of his Goodes Plantacions servants
slaves Effects and estate Wherever hee they or any of them is, are, or shall bee
found all and singular such sumes and sumes of Money goods Parts Merchandises
Effects and things whatsover as the said Capt John Lingley or any other person
doth or doo owe or have in his heere or any of his heeres hands possession or custody
due belonging or appertaining unto the said Constituant Mr John Rawdon, And the
said by bond bill Note Receipt Covenant Contract Promise or sequit of Goods or
otherwise for what cause reason or means soever Nothing excepted nor Reserved
with all costs damages and interests, Also to compound and agree by Arbitration or other
wise and to accept with and take account of the said Capt John Lingley or any other
person or persons whatsoever whom it doth or may concern. Upon recovery and
receipt of the premises or any part thereof to make passe due quiet and quietness
and discharge And for the better and more speedy Effecting the premises in case
of refusal or delay thereon the said Constituant doth hereby further authorize
and empower his said Attorneys Joyntly and severally for him to appear in all
Courts and before all sorts Judges and Justices to defend answere and reply
to all matters and Causes touching or concerning the premises and to sue sue out
for attachment arrest imprisonment and to condemn, and out of prison againe, when need
shall bee to deliver likewise Our Attorneys or words to like or limited power under
them Or either of them to make and substitute and the same to revoke, &
generally in and concerning the premises and the dependences thereof to doo say transact &
accomplish all and what soever the said Constituant himself might or could doo personally
although the matter required more speciall authority than heerein is Comprised, The
said Constituant promise hereby to have and to hold for good firm and unvalled
for ever all and what soever his said Attorneys or either of them or their substitutes
shall Lawfully doe or cause to be done in and about the premises by vertue of these
presents In witness whereof the said Constituant hath hereunto put his hand and seal
