Then came Matthew Nelson Merchant and made Oath before us that the within mentioned or written account amounting to two thousand thirty eight pounds of Tobacco were delivered unto Amos Parsons, and that these are the prices w^{ch} are mentioned

William Plummer maketh oath in Court this 12th March 1677 that hee delivered from goods of Matthew Nelsons amounting to seventy pounds of Tobacco to Amos Parsons

Thomas Tull appeared on y^e behalf of the plaintiff and was examined upon Oath but not taken in Writing
This Court finds that there is due from Matthew Nelson to the plaintiff for the first service two thousand pounds of Tobacco and for eighty and Workings dayes afterwards due to Amos Parsons two thousand and fifty pound of Tobacco in all two thousand four hundred & fifty pound of Tobacco whereof paid two thousand one hundred and eighty pounds of Tobacco Remains due to the plaintiff three hundred and seven pounds of Tobacco and thereupon orders that William Plummer Attorney to Matthew Nelson pay unto the plaintiff Amos Parsons or his order three hundred and seven pounds of Tobacco forthwith to the costs of such aled Expenses
