Upon the petition of Thomas Jillett that hee came into this Province with Capt. Rogers Angell  
who hee was to serve by Indenture four yeares from his arrivall in this Province, that his  
time of servitude was expired on the twenty first day of February last, and that his  
Master John Baker refused to give him a discharge, and that hee humbly requested an order  
of the Court for his freedom and his freedom come & that, w<sup>th</sup> petition being read, and  
heard John Baker appeared in person to answer the same, and the same being fully  
argued and the judgment of the Court here that the said Thomas Jillett is free, and it  
is ordered by the Court here that the said John Baker pay unto the said Thomas Jillett  
his freedom come and that hee according to Act of Assembly

Be it are to Authorize and Impower Christopher Rousey and Robert Redgely gent to be my  
lawfull Attorneys to prosecute for me Our Acc<sup>on</sup> against John Burges and the rest of the Cou<sup>ns</sup>  
of the County Court of Chm<sup>br</sup> Brundoll, in the Provinceall Court Ratifying and confirming what  
my said Attorneys or either of them shall doe therein In witness whereof I have hereunto sett  
my hand and seal this ninth day of December One thousand six hundred & seventy nine

Maryland ss This Indenture made the third day of January in the yeare of our Lord God one thousand six hundred  
seventy Nyned Between John Ward of Saint Marys County in this Province aforesaid on the one  
part and John Barndt of the City of Saint Marys Innholder on the other part Which Indenture  
Witnesseth that the said John Ward for and in consideration of the full sume & just quantity of two thousand  
Eight hundred pounds of Tobacco good found Merchantable Tobacco and Caffe by the said John Barndt to  
him the said John Ward well and truly contented satisfied and paid before the enyding and delivery  
of these presents Doth Covenant promise grant and Agreed to and with him the said John Barndt to  
serve him the said John his heire or assigns from the day of the date hereof untill the full end & term  
of twenty two months in such service or employment as he the said John Barndt his heire or assigns  
shall imploy him in during the said term, In further consideration whereof the said John Barndt  
doth Covenant promise grant & agreed to and with the said John Ward to find and allow him good &  
sufficient meate drinks washing & lodging during the said term In Witness whereof the said parties  
have hereunto sett their hands and seals the day and yeare first above written
