Maryland for By virtue of a warrant of Survey bearing date the 4th day of May 1690 granted
by the said hono Charles Deane of Kent County, gentl directed to the
Surveyor General of this Province or his Deputy, being in pursuance of a former grant unto
the said Hinson and M: Joseph Wicks of the same County, gentl bearing date the twentieth
of May 1679. To Survey three several tracts of Land in the said County, lying in the
Eastern Neck Containing One thousand four hundred acres according to the Ancient
bounds, And the same to divide into two equal parts between the said Hinson and the
said Wicks.

I the Surveyor General do certify that I Edward Sweatnam foreman Surveyor by the hono George Lowe
Eng: Surveyor genl of the said Province, to r: Survey and Divide the said three Land tracts ac
aforesaid, have laid out for the said Joseph Wicks to the Twelfth day of June 1690 a
tract of Land Called Wicks two Division formerly Wickliff, lying on the East
side of Chappel bay in Kent County in Chappel River. Beginning at a marked bush
white oak tree standing on the point of Land leading from the said Wicks two house
to the oyster shell Landing over against, a long point of Marsh that make the mouth
of the said River head by a pond side in the said Marsh, And running from the said bushes
oak along the Eastern bay side North west four hundred and twelve perches to a
bound Locust Logg sticking in a Marsh neare a Cove Called Cabin Cove, & from
the said Locust Logg running still North west over the said Cove due hundred and twenty
perches to another Logg sticking in the Marsh on the other side of the said Cove
and from the end of the north west line by a line drawn north west with eighty five
perches. And from the end of the north west line by a direct line drawn to a bound
white oak tree standing on the edge of the woods by the said Marsh side, And
from the said great white oak by a line drawn East half a point southerly (being
the line of Division) b/w:ne the said John Hinson and Joseph Wicks, unless its —
further to the water of a Creek running out of Chappel River Called Long neck Creek
therefrom the end of the East and half a point southerly line by a line drawn from the
south end of the said Long neck Creek south East one hundred and twenty perches
then from the end of the south East line by a line drawn south west twenty eight
perches to a Creek side Called Short neck Creek running out of the River aforesaid
then from the end of the south west line by a line drawn south east over the said Short neck
Creek to a marked Chaffitt flake sticking in the Marsh one hundred and forty perches
Then from the said Chaffitt flake att the last, southeast line end by a direct line drawn
to the first bounded bush white oak tree bound on the west by the said Eastern Bay
on the north by the East half a point southerly line, on the East by the said Long neck
Creek side River, and on the south by the aforesaid line drawn from the aforesaid
Chaffitt flake to the first bounded white oak tree, continuing and now laid out for eight
