To all unto whom these presents shall come greeting Know Yee that on the day of the date hereof personally came and appeared before me Samuel Shrimpton of Boston in the said Colony Merchant and acknowledged the within written Proclamation or Letter of Attorney unto which his Name is subscribed to be his Act and Deed, and for more clear Evidence hereof Did in my presence seal and deliver the said for the use hereof Expressly, Also the said Samuel Shrimpton and Nathaniel Elkin his servant have deposited upon oath that the amount hereunto taken out of the book of accounts amounting to the sum of One hundred and twenty one pounds Eleven shillings three pence half penny is what the estate of James Drowne formerly of Salem in the said Colony Merchant dec^d doth stand really truly and due unto the said Shrimpton for goods Carried by and sent unto him by the said Drowne by his order unto Maryland, besides what is due unto him from said estate by the or Acc^t in the said Shipp hereunto also annexed, being the one half of twenty three thousand Six hundred forty nine pounds of Tobacco, and for a piece of silver, with amount the said Shrimpton deposited that the said James Drowne hath unto him included in a Letter Dated the 24th of May 1675 from his dwelling house in Salem as a true account of their partnership Relating to their Trade in Maryland, and that the said Shrimpton account of 10th to the
