 controversies to be referred as aforesaid And that the said John Browne on the
 behalfe of the said Samuel Sturimpton shall accept of the same accordingly And
 lastly we do award that upon payment or lawfull tender made at the State
 house in St Marys of the Tobatto bills and money due of the said party's vizt
 the said Charles Lord Baltimore for and on the behalfe of him selfe and the said
 John Browne as attorney and for and on the behalfe of the said Samuel Sturimpton
 shall signe Seale and in the severall Acts and articles deliver the one of
 them to the other or to their severall best severall releases and discharges of &
 for all differences and matters of controversy to be referred from the beginning
 of the world until the day of the date of the said Obligations And the same
 soe made signed Sealed & delivered shall have or cause to be delivered
 and left at the State house in St Marys to be taken by each party when they
 shall request the same In witness whereof we the said Arbitrators have caused
 two parts of this our award to be made both of our tenor and to both parts
 hereof have putt our hands and Seale the first and twentieth day of
 February In the year of our Lord One thousand Six hundred & Eighty

 acknowledge to have receivd of the said Charles Lord Baltimore for
 the use of the said Samuel Sturimpton the sume of Ninety one pounds New
 England money whith I declare to be in full payment of and for what
 is awarded in money and Tobatto to be payd to me for the use
 aforesaid by the said award In witness whereof I have hereunto putt
 my hand and Seale the first and twentieth day of February: 1680.
