was not nor am not any wayes concerned in them, and that my name was made
use of pro forma, and doth hereby disclaim any right thereto or
interest, wherewithal I might have in respect of the manuering of my name in
the bill of lading or Indorse, as witness my hand this twenty day of —

This Day to witt the six and twentieth day of October in the fifth year of the Dominion
of the Right hono^rble Charles Lord Baltimore De Thmo^r 1680 before George Hodgson
of Charles County Surgeon being bound by recognizance to answer the complaint of the
Hon^rble Philip Calvert Esq^r Judge for probate of Will & concerning a certaine abuse by him
committed against the said Judge in contumaciously refusing to deliver back Letter of
Administracion by him the said George fraudulently and upon false & suspicious obtaines
from the said Judge upon the State of Lawnes Rasps dictated to whom he pleased
himself to be Principal & do therby said George confessing his contempt in
Disobedience to the said Lord, and begging the said Lord pardon in open Court. And
submitting himself to the Court, the Court doth order that he bee discharged of his
Recognizance, he paying eight hundred pounds of Tobacco to the said George the Judge
for probate of will & for the charge in finding after the said George Hodgson
into Charles County about the said Letter of Administracion

By this publick instrument of Procuracion or letter of attorney to it shewne and
manifest unto all people that on the second day of the month of October anno
Domini 1678 and in the fiftieth year of the reign of our soveraigne Lord
Charles the second King of England &c before me William Stocky Notary
and Notarion publick by authority of our said soveraigne Lord the King admitt
and witness dwelling in his City of London and in the presence of his witness
