

To his Maj:ly his Servt on Successe in any bond or bonds for Governing Navigation
 where hee conuion or conuions of such bond or bonds are not or shall not be duly per-
 formed according to the said Charter, and to Recover and reward of all and every such
 person and persons that shall have summe or sumes of Money or other things as shall by
 Reason of such bond or bonds be come due to his Maj:ly, rendering an account to mee
 his said Christopher Rous by his Maj:ly his Cll:le of his Maj:ly to Custome &
 duties within the said Province of Maryland, And I doo hereby my selfe my said
 Commission Attorney with full power and authority Generallie to act, and doo as
 shalby and effectually as if I were personally present, and did the same, Ratifying and
 confirming whatever my said Commission and Attorney shall lawfully doe in relation ther-
 eunto or any of them, And if it shall so happen (with God for bid) that my said
 Attorney or Commission before mentioned should depart the Province before hee returne
 unto the Province, then and in that case I doo hereby authorize and appoint John
 Griggs of Calverts County to be my Commissioner and Attorney to act unto and
 purposed as I have before by this premit empowred him Robert Ridgeley, and hee the said
 John Griggs in all the said Matter and things before mentioned to act, and doo as fully
 and shalby as if the said Robert Ridgeley had sworne his Testimony whereof I haue here-
 unto set my hand, and seal the tenth day of May in the year of our Lord One
 thousand five hundred eightysix.

This Indenture made & twentie day of Aprill in the fiftieth year of the Raigne of the Sovreign
 Lord Charles & second King of great Britani France & Ireland Defensor of the faith &c
 between Thomas Gerard of St. Clements Maner in the Province of Maryland Esq: of the one part
 John Shanks of the same Province Plant: of the other part witnesseth that Thomas Gerard
 for a valueable Consideracion in hand alredy paid before & sealing & delivery of these presents
 hath bargained & sold & by these presents doth bargain & sell unto Ed: John Shanks one
 tract or piece of Land lying situate & being in the Maner Commonly knowne or called by
 the name of St. Clements Maner in the aforesd Province & now in the tenure or occupa-
 tion of him & Ed: Gerard wch piece of Land is knowne & called by the name of Little Hackly
 & is now in the possession of him & Ed: Shanks being bounded as followeth: beginning at the
 Westward point of Little Hackly aforesd & so running downe the Bay to a small Crooke or
 branch wch borders the Land now in the possession or occupation of John Shanks to a little Cedar
 Tree & from thence to a white Oak or tree with nine Notches or marks
 another white Oak standing by a marsh side wch is the head of St. Patricks Cr the like
 wise marked with nine notches & from thence to a small crooke wch is marked with nine Notches
 & so downe the Crooke wch borders White Oak & Little Hackly & to the Northwest point of
 Little Hackly Cont: by estimation three hundred acres or there abouts to as more or less
 with f. 33 vigrage)
