with the said Deed as of the gifts of the said William and Francis, and have for them
their heirs heirs and assigns Lawfull Heirs of the said Robert Carville his
heirs and Assigns for ever

Ward of Calvert County gent do hereby give notice that at a provincial Court held at the City of St Mary the
seventeenth day of June in the forty sixth year of the Dominion of Charles the Second One thousand six hundred eighty
and two the said Matthew Ward obtained a Judgment against Daniel Juniper gent for the Sum of thirty three pounds
seven shillings and six pence and also the sum of
pounds of Tobacco for costs of charge
expended in the said suit, And whereas at the same time the said Daniel Juniper and Richard Moy of the City
of St Mary the said Juniper did obtain a Judgment to the said Matthew Ward

they had why Execution should not issue for the said thirty three pounds seven shillings and six pence and also for the
