 shall wholly remaine and be unto the said Robert Carville his Execut^t & Administrato^r or

This Indenture made the twenty-first day of August in the year of our Lord
 One thousand five hundred eighty and one between Robert Carville of the County of St
 Mary's gentl. of the one part, & William Holme of the same County planter of the other part
 Witnesseth that whereas William Lucas in his life-time had by and to Francis now wife to
 the said William Holme had agreed to sell and convey unto Henry Ryder a parcel of land
 lying and being upon the said farme in a certaine tract in the said County, bounded upon
 the said land by a marked oak tree by a marked post in the parts of the
 lands wherein the said William Lucas then lived and by the same land out and bounded in
 his life time, But before a conveyance of the said land was executed the said Lucas
 dyed leaving in his last will and Testament in writing by said Francis sole executrix
 and
