 basens, One old powder salt & sh<sup>r</sup>, One old powder cup, One old powder saucer, One old  
 powder bottle, One old powder boring, two old tinn Gunde sticks, One old wine  
 Gunde stick, One small Iron dripping pann, One Iron ladle, One flesh fork, One old  
 tinn pudding pann, One old small brass still, One girdle, & One spitt, a broken  
 pott hang<sup>r</sup>, One Iron distill, One pair of old Tonges, an old Brass kettle, Two Iron  
 potts One One six Gallons, the other four Gallons, One Digger, One Tray, One globe  
 One small table, One Wall Rail, One Looking glass, Seven rapping hooles five  
 of them at William Baydens, One old frying pann, One earthen Duptin, One Case of

In one forty foot tobacco house about one thousand pounds of tobacco hanging  
 and about seven hogheads of Indian Corn unmeasured, In another forty foot  
 tobacco house about six hogheads of Indian Corn more unmeasured, & One  
 hoghead more of Corn lofted in the said house with one Thomas Abbott the  
 Overseer claimed as part of his share, and by the Informacon of the said  
 Thomas Abbott four hogheads of Corn more disposed of by Mary Godfrey for the  
 house use. In another forty foot tobacco house about four hundred pounds of tobacco  
 more hanging, about three hogheads of tobacco in another forty house, & One hog  
 head part the one hoghead of tobacco disposed of by Thomas Abbott as part of  
 his share to Mr. G<sup>r</sup>und, and four hogheads of tobacco more by the Informacon of  
 George Clarke disposed of by Mary Godfrey into the said Mr. G<sup>r</sup>und out of the frop  
 of Corn & Tobacco. Thomas Abbott & George Clarke claimed some of them a share the  
 Corn to be divided into five shares, and the Tobacco into five shares and a halfe.  
 according to their Informacon. In the Barn a partell of Cattel in straw & a partell  
 of damaged wheate in straw, which George Clarke informed us that one halfe belongs  
 to him, Early p<sup>r</sup>ted of dryed betts, four flittards of dryed betts, one pair of small stillyard  
 One old talking frame, One old hand saw, One old drawing knife, One Sym<sup>r</sup>ter, and Bell.

At the Plantacon at Nanj<sup>m</sup>y

Two old blanketts, One old rugg, One old flock bed, One old fittails bed, One Iron pott contains about  
 one Gallon & halfe & poot hooles, One old powder Basen, about three barrels of Indian Corn in  
 the Tobacco house about one thousand pounds of tobacco hanging, One hoghead of tobacco  
 disposed of by Thomas Harrison with six his share and make his frop three, and two  
 hogheads more disposed of by Mary Godfrey to Mr. G<sup>r</sup>und, Thomas Harrison  
 disposed of his to Nicholas Brad, the one halfe of the Corn carryed away by Thomas  
 Harrison with laye claim to halfe the Corn & tobacco made there. Two sowd
