Be it remembred that John Abington of Colbert County Plaintiff who doth sue for himself & Mr. George Kidd in his behalf prosecutes before the Court here to make stand & be informed that William Kidd of Hunting Creek in the County of Colbert aforesaid Plaintiff before this date and twenty-first day of October in the fourth year of His Dominion of His Royal Highness Charles the Second & aforesaid and the eight and twenty-first day of the same month of October in aforesaid year wilfully & unwillingly traded, bartered, committed & delivered to William Kingsley a Runaway Servant of His said John Abington for an unbound bagg of the value of fifty pounds of Tobacco being the proper goods of him the said John Abington against a certain Act of Assembly Intituled an Act relating to Servants and Slaves, enacted at a General Assembly held at the City of St. Marys the fifteenth day of May in the fifty year of the Dominion of His Royal Highness Charles the Second by His said William Kidd for the sum of Two hundred pounds of Tobacco whereupon the said John Abington as will for the said Proprietary as for himself in his behalf prayeth the advice of the Court and that the said John Abington may have His may fy of the said Servant according to the form of the said Act of Assembly whereof that the said William may have his in Court Judgment upon the said Plaintiff.

Whereupon the said William Kidd charged y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post that he should keep him well y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post promised to performe if further sayeth that

John Boyce age & twenty three years or thereabouts sworn in Court sayeth that when William Kingsley returned to his Master's Plantation y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post enquired of him where the bagg was the said William Kingsley told him he had hung it upon the Girted in the Tobacco house whereupon y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post went thither to look for it but could not find it till he said William Kingsley told y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post he had pulled it down & carryed it out but brought your D<sup>r</sup>. post back & narrow'd it upon y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post went thither to inquire for it but the man told him he knew nothing of it neither did he said William Kingsley lately been there said y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post further sayeth that coming again he enquired further of the said William Kingsley where the bagg was and he told y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post he was gathering some before he run away, whereto y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post went to search for it and found a place near the fence where the said William Kingsley had made a fire and broaste said of bacon but yet y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post could not find the bagg then the said William Kingsley told y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup>. post he had sold the bagg to William Kidd for a Poule &
