

All that Lott or partell of ground to the said Court house belonging ad the same is now layd out limited and bound. & that is to say beginning with a locust post standing by the street side at the South end of the Court lott of the East street and running for length two hundred foot to another locust post bounding on the East, by a line drawn South one hundred foot to another locust post bounding on the South with a line drawn West two hundred foot to another locust post bounding on the West by a line drawn North one hundred foot to the first named post bounding on the West by the said street containing in all (to the same more or less) within said Court house prison, and partell of land are situate lying and being in the Town of Newyarmouth in the said County of Kent with all singular Rights priviledg'd and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold the said Court house Prison and partell of land wth the appurtenances unto the said Charles Lord Baltimore his heirs and assignes for ever to the use intent and purpose therein after mentioned and to be used to be the use and behoofe of the Lord Justice of the peace for the said County of Kent and successively to be by them used occupy'd and mploy'd (as a house and place of Justice and Indurature and not otherwise) And the said James Quiggold for himself his heirs and assignes doth give consent and Grant to and with the said Charles Lord Baltimore his heirs and assignes That it shall and may be lawfull to and for the said Charles Lord Baltimore his heirs and assignes from time to time and at all times hereafter quietly and peaceably to hold and enjoy the said Court house & Prison and other the things with the appurtenances without the least trouble or interruption of him the said James Quiggold his heirs or assignes or any other person or persons whatsoever claiming by from or under him them or any of them And that the said Charles Lord Baltimore his heirs and assignes and every of them shall and may at all times for ever hereafter stand and be seized of the said Court house Prison and partell of land to the use intent and purpose herein before mentioned and declared and to no other use intent or purpose whatsoever In witness whereof the said James Quiggold to this present Indenture hath putt his hand and Seal the day and year first above written.
