 put & constituted And by these presents do make Ordain and in my said and place
 do put and constitute John Walston of the County of Baltimore in Maryland
 at present in London my true and Lawfull Attorney and Assignee for me and in
 my name and to my use by all due and Lawfull wayes and means whatsoever
 to the demand Legacy due for recover and receive of George Parker late of the County
 of Kent Jurisdiction at present in the County of Calvert in Maryland aforesaid or
 of the heirs or goods whatsoever they shall be found due payment of Satisfaction
 of One Obligation bearing date the fourth day of December Anno One
 thousand six hundred eighty and five Wherunto and wherby the said George Parker
 together with One William Smallwood is Obliged unto me in the sum or penalty of
 three score and two pounds of Lawfull money of England with Condition for the
 payment of Six and thirty pounds - seven Shillings and six pence of like money on the
 fourth day of December which should be in the year of Our Lord 1688: as by the
 said Obligation and Condition more at large may appear. And of the Receipt to
 give due acquittance & discharge. And if need be for the purpose to appear in and Court
 before all Lordes Governours Judges and Justices And to pursue Inquest being by
 Arrest arreft Imprisonment and to condemn out of prison againe when need shall be
 to deliver With ample power to substitute And generally to do further Conclude
 Execute and Determine all and every other thing and thing whatsoever in or about
 the premises shall be needfull and convenient as fully and specially ad. July 25th
 which shall be Lawfully done in the premises by virtue of these presents And
 Witness the hand of I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the One and
 Twentieth day of August Anno Domini 1688 And in the fourth and thirtieth year
 of the Reigne of Our Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second of England &c.

 Province of Maryland unto the full and exact quantity of three hundred thirty
 and seven Winchester bushells of the said Indian Corn & also twenty hogheads
 of Tobacco the weight of the said Tobacco as aforesaid being bound for Boston in
 New England I the said Jarvis Ballard do hereby engage my self my heirs
 Executors and Assigns and every of them to give the said Henry Darnall on
 the third or fourth day of the next ensuing month of what I shall or do file
 the said Corn and Tobacco for or returned to the said Henry Darnall according to
 his order provided the said Shipp arriveth at the aforesaid ports of Boston
