Memorandum that this fourteenth day of May in the second year of y^e Dominion of Charles the Second and in the year of Our Lord God One Thousand Six hundred Seventy and Six before me Philip Calvert Esq^r Chancellor of the province of Maryland and one of the Justices of the Provincial Court at my house at Popes Creek hold in the City of St Marys personally appeared Thomas Nottley above named in his proper person and did Consent that judgement should pass against him for the said Sum of Twenty Six Thousand four hundred Sixty and four pounds of Tobacco at the Suits of the said Thomas Nottley in manner and forme as the said Thomas Nottley above against him hath declared

The Deposition of George Charlsworth aged about Sixty two years Sworne Saith that John Derry came to this Deponent to John Baker about the twelveth day of November 1674 & told this Deponent that he had a note for five Thousand three hundred pounds of tobacco from M^r Marke Cordoa and asked this Deponent if he would accept of it or not this Deponent told him he would provided he would take it in such Commodities as this Deponent had and the said Derry answered this Deponent no he must have ready Tobacco and this Deponent answered him again that he had six hoggsheads of tobacco Struck weighed Two Thousand eight hundred Seaventy five pounds of tobacco and after that he provided in other Commodities as much as made it amount to the Sum of Nine Thousand eight hundred Seaventy three pounds of tobacco Out of which Summ yo^r Deponent was to pay the aforesaid note for five thousand three hundred pounds of tobacco first before other debts whoso of this Deponent did not owe him about five hundred pounds of tobacco upon last year and now this present Court he proffered this deponent Tobacco & said he was in this Deponent's debt & he would pay him & yo^r Deponent answered him again he owed him none but thought he was in his Debt & he would pay him as soon as he could & this Deponent saith that he was appointed by M^r Quigly to come three Seaveral times to come and take in his bills and this Deponent came if M^r Quigly was at home M^r Derry was absent and if M^r Derry was at home then M^r Quigly was not at home and soe from time yo^r Deponent
