Memorandum That this ... day of October in the yoor of Our Lord 1682 Came before us two of his Majesties Justices of the provinciall Court Wm Holmes & Frances his wife & Robert Carvile ptyes to these presents & acknowledged the within writon Indenture to be their proper acts & doods And the said Frances being by us alone & secretly examined according to the forme of a Certaine Act of Assembly in that Case made & provided Did acknowledge the lands & promises in the within writon dood mentioned to be the right of the said John Baker within named As of the gift of them the said William Frances & Robert & save for them & their hoires remised & made quitt claime thereof to the said John Baker his hoires & Assignes for ever

This Indenture made the fifth Day of the ninth month called November in the yoor one thousand six hundred eighty & three Between William Sharp of Calvert County in the province of Maryland of the one partie & Francis Billingsly Richard Johns John Pardo & William Harris all of the parts in Calvert County plantors of the other partie Witnesseth that the said William Sharp for divers good causes & Considerations him hereunto moving but Especially for & in Consideration of the sume of twelve pence Sterling in hand paid by the said Richard Johns with Consent & on behalfe of himself & partners to the said William Sharp the receipt whereof by these presents the said William Sharp doth Confesse & acknowledge himself fully satisfied of every part & parcel thereof & from every part & parcel thereof the said William Sharp doth Exonerate acquit & discharge & for ever release them the said Francis Billingsly Richard Johns John Pardo & William Harris their hoires & Assignes for ever have exonerated granted alienated sold & conveyed & for himself his hoires & Assignes doth by these presents grant bargain sell alien & firm & in fee all that one parcel of Land lying upon the Cists in Calvert County aforesaid being part of a parcel of land called Garges Chance Contoyning six hundred acres more or less & now in the tenor or occupation of the said William Sharp beginning at a locust post on the East with a fine drawne west tweloe porches to a marked post for breadth & from the said post with a line drawne north twenty porches to another post for length & so East for tweloe porches to a locust post & so south twenty porches to the first marked post Contoyning & now laid out for one acre & halfe of land to the same little more or less together with all rights priviledges waies easments profits & appurtenances to the same belonging to have and to hold the said one acre & halfe of land to them the said Francis Billingsly Richard Johns John Pardo & William Harris their hoires & Assignes for ever to their owne proper use & behoofe & to the use & behoofe hereafter mentioned & Contoynd that isto say that the people of God commonly called Quakers shall have right & priviledge from tyme to tyme to meet upon the said ground a house there to erect & build & their all pleasure to meet & bury their dead & from tyme to tyme the house to maintaine & repaire & enlarge their graves & fences to keep up & repaire & all their severall meetings there to keep & peaceably to enjoy from tyme to tyme & for ever without the lett suit trouble molestacion vexacion or any other Incumbrance of any kind or Nature whatsoever of from or by them their hoires or Assignes or any other person or persons whatsoever claiming any right title priviledge or Interest by or from them the said Francis Billingsly Richard Johns John Pardo & William Harris their hoires Excut & Assignes for ever & the said William Sharp doth farther Covenant for himself his hoires & Assignes & to & with the said Francis Billingsly Richard Johns John Pardo & William Harris their hoires Excut & Assignes that he hath a true Right & title Interest & lawfull possession to & in the said Land so to alienate sell & dispose & doth by vertue of these presents so sell alienate & dispose from him his hoires & Assignes all that said parcel & tract of Land Contoyning in quantity one acre & halfe bounded as abovesaid to the said Francis Billingsly Richard Johns John Pardo & William Harris their hoires & Assignes

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
