This Indenture made the Eight and twentieth day of April in the year of  
our Lord God one thousand six hundred eighty and four between the Right hon<sup>ble</sup>  
Charles Lord Baron of Baltimore and the Lady Jane his Consort formerly his widow  
and Relict of Henry Sewall Esquire deceased on the one part and the hon<sup>ble</sup> Henry  
Darnall and John Darnall of Calvert County in the province of Maryland Esq<sup>rs</sup> on the  
other part (Whoredad (a kind of noble meadow) late father of the said Charles Lord  
Baltimore and Lord and prop<sup>ty</sup> of the said province of Maryland by his Letters  
patents under the great seals of the said province bearing date the twentieth day  
of April in the fourth and thirtieth year of his Dominion Annoq<sup>ue</sup> Dni 1665  
for the consideration therein mentioned did grant unto the said Darnall and  
by the name of Jane Sewall the Relict of Henry Sewall Esq<sup>er</sup> deceased all that  
parcel of land Ertted into a manor and called Matta pany Sewall lying in  
Calvert County on the south side of Pultuxen River beginning at a marked oak  
standing at the mouth of a creek called Gardiners creek and running down  
the creek Easterly for breadth two hundred and ten perches to a marked oak  
by the River side near the mouth of a small creek bounding on the East with a  
line drawn southe and by East into the woods for the length of six hundred and  
sixty perches to a marked oak on the south with a line drawn west to a marked  
white oak standing in a drye valley on the west with a line drawn north from  
the said oak to the first marked tree at the mouth of Gardiners creek on the  
north with a path in the River containing and then layd out for one thousand and  
more or lesse And also a parcel of land lying in Calvert County on the south side  
of Pultuxen River near Matta pany beginning at a marked oak by the River  
side of the land of the said Sewall by the River side and running Easterly by the said  
creek Eighty and five perches to a marked pine tree bounding on the East by  
a line drawn southe and by East three hundred and seventy and eight perches  
to a marked oak bounding on the south by a line drawn west Eighty and  
five perches to a marked pine tree bounding to the land of the said  
Sewall bounding on the west with the said land on the north with the said  
and then layd out for two hundred and more or lesse together with all
