KNOW all men by these presents that I John Swinstead of the Island aforesaid have  
Ordained made and constituted by and my stand and place by these presents put and constituted  
my trusty and well-beloved friend Bartholomew Emallo of Dorchester County in Maryland  
my true and lawfull Attorney for me and in my name, and to my use to ask sue for, have,  
require receive and receive, all & every such debts & summe of money as are due owing &  
belonging, or appertaining unto me by any manner of way or means whatsoever from any  
person or persons whatsoever, residing or being in Maryland aforesaid, or in Virginia,  
Giving and granting unto my said Attorney by these presents my full and whole power  
strength and authority in and about the premises, and upon the receipt of any such debts or  
summe of money, whether by bill bonds, account or otherwise, acquittance, or other discharge  
or discharge for me and in my name to make take and deliver, and all and every other thing  
and thing and thing, devise, and devise in the law whatsoever needfull and necessary  
to be done, in or about the premises, for the recovery of all or any such debts or summes of  
money as aforesaid, for me and in my name to do execute and perform as fully largely and  
amply in every respect to all intents constructions and purposes as I might my selfe or could  
doe if I were personally present, ratifying, allowing, and holding firm, and stable, all and  
every such thing, as my said Attorney shall lawfully doe or cause to be done, in or about the  
execution of the same, by vertue hereof In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand  
and seal this thirteenth day of August 1663. in the 11<sup>th</sup> year of his Majesty's reign.

Thomas Pemberton late of Southampton County Gent otherwise called Thomas Pemberton  
of Southampton County Merchant was summoned to answer unto Humphrey Jervis Knight of  
the City of Dublin in the Kingdom of Ireland Merchant of a plea that he owed unto him  
his reasonable account of the summe in which he was indebted & received of the money &  
goods & Merchandises of him the said Humphrey, which he never justly brought.  
And upon the said Humphrey by Anthony Underwood his Attorney saith that whereas  
the said Thomas Pemberton was indebted & received of the money goods & Merchandises  
of him the said Humphrey in the Province of Maryland aforesaid between the twenty the day  
of August in the year of our Lord One thousand six hundred & Eighty and the twenty  
fourth day of May 1663. and by the same time he received of the money goods and  
Merchandises of him the said Humphrey (that is to say) at Nantuxet river in the aforesaid  
Province of Maryland the 30<sup>th</sup> day of October 1660. by the hands of In: Wallis Master of  
the good Ship Elizabeth of Liverpool Our Cargo of goods and Merchandises containing  
four hundred hundred gallons of rum two thousand, Our hundred forty six pounds of sugar  
two Negroes, Savu dor: and eight pair of shoes, Our three and three barrels of Mellasse  
Eleven yards of Cloth Our hundred and twenty doz: of quart glass bottles filled with  
Guany And also during the time aforesaid to wit the first day of March Anno 1661:  
at the place aforesaid by the hands of the aforesaid John Wallis the Commander of the  
good Ship Mary of Dublin, Our other Cargo of goods and Merchandises amounting to the  
summe of One hundred and three pounds six shillings & seven pence half penny just lost in  
Ireland as by a particular account or Invoyn ready here in Court to be produced may  
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
