

Now know at this day towitt the eight day of March in the year of our Lord 1604.  
 Came the said Nicholas Blackiston and Samuel Cooper who aswell for our Sovereign  
 Lord the King and the Chief Governour aforesaid as for the shippes by their Attorney  
 aforesaid And the said John Woodside by his said Attorney likewise came and the  
 Jurors of that Jury came also to witt Cap: Henry Smith, Thomas Doe, Nicholas Smith  
 Robert Smith, Cornelius Watkinson, George Ashman, Christopher Nutter, Thomas Miles,  
 John Swall, Walter Woodroffe, Henry Lewis, and Peter Card who to say the truth  
 in the premises being: lectured and sworn: Upon their Oathes doe say that they  
 find the said John Woodside: Guilty of the premises in manner aforesaid in the  
 Informations above: all adged against him, Whereupon it is Considered by the  
 Court that the Commodities, goods, wares, and Merchandises aforesaid with the Informations  
 above specified And the Shipp aforesaid with all the guns, tackle, furniture, ammunitions  
 and apperrell be lost and forfeited according to the tenor of the Statute aforesaid  
 viz: One third part thereof to our said Sovereign Lord the King and the other third part  
 the said Nicholas Blackiston and Samuel Cooper who aswell for our Sovereign Lord the King  
 and the said Lord Prop: Chief Governour: of this Province, and the other third part thereof to  
 the said Lord Prop: Chief Governour: as for the shippes: prosecuted according to the tenor  
 of the Statute aforesaid in that case made: and provided: And the Defect in Mercy &c:  
 Blackiston and Samuel Cooper who aswell as that Cap: In: Bourne, Mr. James Dashiell  
 Appraisors to be in appraise and value the said Shippes ammunitions guns tackle  
 and apperrell and goods therein brought to the best of their understanding and  
 knowledge on or before the last day of March instant. And that on or before the  
 said last day of March instant they the said Appraisors under their hands and  
 Seals deliver into the hands of Col: William Stroude of the County aforesaid  
 Collector in these parts and specially appointed since the death of Mr. Christopher  
 Appraisant by them to be made in writing, who is also by the said Court Ordred  
 with all possible speed to transmitt and send the same to the said Hon: Col: Col:  
 Henry Darvall, Col: William Digge, and Nicholas Blackiston aforesaid or  
 any or either of them, And the said Col: William Stroude is by the said Court  
 authorized and Incharged to Administer the usuall oath of an Appraisor to the  
 aforesaid Appraisors: And that the said Col: William Stroude, and the said Sam: Cooper  
 Deputy Comptroller and Surveyor: of his Maj:stys Custowde, rates, duties, and  
 Impositions in Somerset County, forthwith take an account in writing of the wages due  
 to each particular Seaman in or belonging to the said Shipp, And to report and send  
 the same together with the Appraisment aforesaid to the said Col: Darvall, Col: Digge,  
 and Nicholas Blackiston or any or either of them, to the end the same may be duly  
 payd out of the Vallues or sumes of the said Appraisment.  
 And the said Court also Ordred that the said Master be the first treated with  
 in order to the purchasing againe of the said Shipp.  
 And that the said Appraisors are to take notice that the goods mentioned in  
 the said Informations and by them to be appraised are as followeth viz: Iron priest  
 of Irish Iron: Iron durui pair: of Shooes, fourty course: Halles, four durui  
 pair: of course: Iron kind.  
 Afterwards the aforesaid Appraisors made returne of Appraisment of the  
 aforesaid Shipp and goods as followeth viz:
