of Maryland for.

Whereas at a Provinciall Court held at the Cittie of St. Maries the eighth day of March  
in the Fiftieth year of the Dominion of Charles Lord Baltimore Esq<sup>r</sup> annoq<sup>r</sup> Dom<sup>r</sup> 1684 a  
the Ship Robert of Lann<sup>r</sup> in Ireland was imprented against her and her crew and  
whereas the Court Ord<sup>r</sup>ed by Consent of N. R. Blackiston and Samuel Cooper &  
that Capt. John O'Sullivan, M<sup>r</sup> James Dashiell, M<sup>r</sup> Richard Whalley and M<sup>r</sup> John King  
should be appoynted to view apprais<sup>r</sup> and value the said Ship Aluminon<sup>r</sup> gun-  
vessels and apparel to the said shipp belonging, and goods contained in the  
Informat<sup>r</sup> on or before the last day of March.

H<sup>r</sup> I am therefore humbly to Certifie that the said persons so appoynted  
apprais<sup>r</sup> and value and took the oath of an Appraiser and on the Ninth day  
of March did apprais<sup>r</sup> the said shipp with her tackle furniture and apparel  
ammunition and guns to One hundred and fifty pounds Sterling, and aftherwards  
the goods mentioned in the Informat<sup>r</sup> on or by Capt. John O'Sullivan Mr. John  
King and Mr. Richard Whalley apprais<sup>r</sup> to Eleuen pounds and one shilling, eight  
pence Sterling which appraisement was returned the Twenty eighth day of March last  
past All w<sup>t</sup> I do Certifie under my hand and seal the second day of April  
Anno Dom<sup>r</sup> 1685.
