

That from and after the Twenty-fifth day of March Anno Domini 1664: No master or
 生长 production or manufacture of Europe should be imported into any
 Island Plantation Colony Territory or place to his Majestys B. longing or w^t: should
 thereafter be long unto or b^r in the possession of his Majestys his heirs and successors
 in Asia Africa or America (Cautionably excepted) but what shall be bona fide and
 without fraud had & taken & stripped in England Wales or the Towne of Barnet upon
 Twents and in English built shipping or w^c. w^r bona fide bought before the first day
 of October 1662: and had such certificates therof as were directed in our Ordinance
 made for preventing of frauds and regulating abuses in his Majestys plantations
 and whereof the Master and have fourteth of the Mariners at least were English and
 wh^t should be carried directly thence to the said land Island plantation & Colonies
 Territories and places and from no other place whatsoever any law Statute or usage
 to the contrary notwithstanding under the penalty of the loss of all such commodity of the
 growth production or manufacture of Europe as should be imported into any of those
 countries any other place whatsoever by land or by water and if by water of the shipps of the
 shipps or V. S. R. in which they were imported with all the goods tackle furniture armament &
 apparel of their parts to his said Majestys his heirs and successors: one third part to
 the Governour of such land Island plantation Colony Territory or place into which such
 goods were imported if the said shipps V. S. R. or goods & thereof should be informed against
 and sent for or otherwise that their part also to his Majestys his heirs and successors
 and the other third part to him or them that should send informer or sue for the same
 in any of his Majestys fourteth in such the said lands Islands Colonies plantation
 Territories or places where the offence was committed or in any Court of Record in
 England by like information plaint or other detec^tion which in no respect
 or way or off law should be allowed and further that whereas in the same Statute
 made at the same time and place aforesaid it was enacted for the better &
 prevention of frauds that from and after the said Twenty-fifth day of March
 1664: Every person importing by land any goods or commodity whatsoever whencever
 the said land Island plantation Colonies territories or places should deliver
 to the Governour of such land Island plantation Colony Territory or place
 or to such person or officer as should be by him hereto authorized and
 appointed within four and twenty hours after such importation his and her
 names and surnames and a true Inventory and particular of all such goods or
 commoditys And no ship coming to any such land Island plantation Colony
 Territory or place should bear or wear any goods or commodity whatsoever
 unless the Master or Comptroller of such ship or V. S. R. should first have made
 known to the Governour of such land Island plantation Colony Territory or place
 or to such person or officer as should be by him hereto authorized
 and appointed the arrival of the said ship or V. S. R. with her name and her
 names and surnames of her Master and Comptroller and had shewⁿ to him that she
 was an English built ship, or made good by producing such certificates as
 aforesaid that she was a ship or V. S. R. bona fide belonging to England Wales
 or the Towne of Barnet upon Twents and navigated with one English Master and
 their fourteth of the Mariners at least Englishmen and had delivered to
 such Governour or other person or officer a true and perfect Inventory over
 Inventory of her lading together with the place or places in wh^t said
