Between Thomas Vaughan of Talbot County in the province of Maryland aforesaid gent. of the one parts and Elizabeth Coursey of the same County and province aforesaid widow of the other parts **Witnesseth** that the said Thomas Vaughan for and in consideration of the sum of twenty thousand pounds of good sound Methable Toba^c and Cash to him in hand well and truly paid by the said Elizabeth Coursey before then sealing and delivery hereof the receipt whereof the said Thomas Vaughan doth hereby acknowledge and thereof doth acquit Exonerate and discharge the said Elizabeth Coursey her heirs Executors and Adm^{inistrators} friends by their procure^{ments} or also for divers good causes and considerations from the said Thomas Vaughan Mowing hath given granted bargained sold alienated released conveyed and confirmed and by these procure^{ments} doth give grant bargain sell alien release Expose and Confirm unto the Elizabeth Coursey her heirs and assigns for ever all that Mortgage or P^{ar}cell and Tract of land called or known by the name of Andorbyes Addition lying and being in the said County of Talbot late in the demise Occupation or possession of the said Thomas Vaughan or his assigns beginning at a Marked Oak on Andorbyes Creek and running North One hundred and sixtie perches then West One hundred perches then South One hundred and sixtie perches then East to the first marked Tree containing and laid out for one hundred Acres of land by the same more or less all that Tract or parcel of land called Andorbye beginning at a Marked Cedar tree running East and by South One hundred perches North by a line drawn West and by North One hundred perches on the West by a line drawn South from the end of the West and
