November in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred forty and five Between
Francis Cliftill of St. Marys County Planter & his heire of Francis Cliftill late of
Calvert County Gentleman of the one part and the Hon^r Nicholas DeWale Esq^r of Calvert
County of the other part Witnesseth that whereas by indenture dated anno Domini
1654 between William Altonhead Gentleman of the one part and the said Francis Cliftill &
father of the other part the said William Altonhead for somer consideration him thereunto
moving did give grant deince and to have sett unto the said Francis Cliftill & his
wife Jane Cliftill and his brother John Cliftill for the term of their lives that he
of Land called Cliftill and commonly known by that name and boyning upon a
 Creek called James Creek on the further side of the Neck and with the same going
to the head of the said Creek on the further side of the said neck in the possession of the
said Francis Cliftill to have and to hold the said land so denised and his
wife Jane and brother John from the last day of the nativity of our Saviour for
lives of the aforesaid mentioned they yditing and paying therefore yearly during
the said lives unto the said William Altonhead his heires & executors or assignes
gent of one Barrell of sound Indian Corn with a chuse of reentry for non paym^t of
the said gent and that the said William Altonhead did hereby Covenant and agree with
the said Francis Cliftill his father that at the date of any of the said lives for the
strict observall to put in emprise lawfull tyme of his own body and for suffis
to continue to him and his heires for ever with other Coven^t therin contained as
by the same indenture under the hand and seal of the said William Altonhead only
any other portion of his life or remenant may more plainly appear
and whereas the said part of land and demise was and is part of the man
of Little Altonhead in said Man^t with all its rights intreates and appertunes
to the same belonging are by several moans nowe granted legally vested in the said
Nicholas DeWale and the said three lives above named being all deince and no new
life or lives thereto putt in or any heriot paid for the remenant of the said
lives and by that means the estate of the said Francis Cliftill and his heirs deter
mined and the said Nicholas DeWale being with the rest of the said man^t in the pos
session and seizure of the said land called Cliftill and the said Francis Cliftill &
party to these presents having an equitable interest in the said by reason of his intre
at the time of his said fathers deince and the said Nicholas DeWale for the ending
all controversies touching the same for his future being willing to purchase the
equitable interest of the said Francis party to these presents and the said Francis
having agreed to sell the same Now it is further Witnesseth that the said
